Meeting Minutes

October 22, 2011

A meeting was held prior to the Yuk Boodle Bash at St. Lukes Church in Westborough, MA.

A motion was made to accept the Minutes of the September 1, 2011 meeting. The motion was unanimously approved.

Calendar of Events: A number of items on the calendar of events were discussed.

Holly Ball – The Club does not have any specific responsibility for the Holly Ball this year.

Cow Loan Party – Will be held in February 2012 at St. Luke's.

Firstie Party – April 2012 – At this point we do not know who will be hosting the Firstie party, but Cathy Snook will be doing the Flags and Coins again.

Finances:

Nicole reported that we are in a very similar financial position to where we were last year. The Club has a cash surplus of approximately \$14,000. Carl and Nicole will be coordinating the State and Federal filings once the year-end financials have been completed.

Parents continue to value the bus service and the Club generates positive cash flow to fund other activities. We are still using Brush Hill. They are more accommodating and easier to schedule than Peter Pan, and less expensive.

Membership:

Nina reported that many new members have signed up and many others have renewed.
