R DAY, BEAST & A WEEKEND TIPS & TRICKS

R DAY & BEAST

- In preparation for R Day, Cadet Candidates should pack all belongings in pack all items in Ziploc XL 10 gallon bags for quick transfer to WP-issued duffle.

- Encourage your Cadet to invite a classmate with no family present to join you for an off-post excursion. This simple gesture will forever be appreciated!

- ⇒ Meander around the Thayer ⇒ Hotel, a national historic landmark. Don't miss the 4th floor where each room has been dedicated to a distinguished WP alum.
- ⇒ Take in the breathtaking views at Trophy Point during each season.

⇒ Attend football games and other athletic events, especially competitions against

Navy and Air Force.

WHAT TO DO

- During the Gray Period (Jan.
 -Mar.), treat your Cadet to a show at Ike Hall.
- ⇒ Challenge your Cadet to a match at the WP Bowling Alley.
- ⇒ Climb the "Stairway to Heaven" inside Arvin Gym.
